# Discipleship originating from Jesus, TÜ.02.02

**Language of Instruction** – English, but written work can also be done in Estonian.

Learning outcomes. After passing the course successfully, the student is able to

- analyse the entire content of the Holy Scriptures on the subject of Discipleship from the perspective of church and social life, and explain the Bible's message on how to make disciples in a relevant way in today's society
- understand the complex relationship between the society and the church in the light of the Biblical teaching and outline a detailed disciple making plan in order to raise Christians who are able to build and maintain authentic relationship between the church and the society
- transform the information, knowledge and insights gained during the studies of this course into culturally relevant approaches and forms of discipleship for the contemporary society.
- Analyse main obstacles and problems of discipleship and offer possible solutions to solve these

## The course's connectedness to Studio "Theology and Identity"

During this course our purpose is to show how a relevant theology - including a biblical understanding on discipleship - can strengthen and nourish somebody's personal faith, how it could lead and hold a local church on the tack of Bible-based ministry, and how these can eventually influence the whole society to be healthier spiritually.

This purpose can be reached by identifying, analysing and understanding the principles and main components of discipleship in the Holy Scriptures, and finding how these can be shape someone's identity, the ministry practice as a natural result, overflow of this identity. We would like to see this Bible-based identity being worked out in concentric circles: in the person's own ministry, in his or her local church, and eventually how this influencing the contemporary society as whole.

March 27	<ul> <li>Writing a detailed personal, relational disciple making plan in a local church's context.</li> <li>The length is 4-5 pages.</li> <li>This DM ministry should be integrated in the student's church.</li> <li>There is empirical mini-research don ion the local church according to the Jesus-like discipleship (how many people are engaged, what obstacles there are, etc.)</li> <li>Details must be described: leader(s), participants, timeframe, fervency, subjects, methodology, tools.</li> <li>Demonstrating a good understanding of the defining questions of today's disciple making ministry.</li> <li>Proving the ability to apply the principles have been found during the course and individual research.</li> </ul>
